REINSTATEMENT ORDER

In review of the settlement agreement signed by Christopher M. Blouin, RCP ("Mr. Blouin" or "Respondent") the New Hampshire Respiratory Care Practitioner Governing Board ("Board"), and in review of the Respondent's motion to amend the settlement agreement and Hearing Counsel's assent thereto, the Board agree to the reinstatement of Mr. Blouin's license to practice Respiratory Care within the State of New Hampshire, subject to the following conditions:

1. Pursuant to the August 10, 2006 Settlement Agreement, the Respondent's license to practice is reinstated.
2. The Respondent shall continue to adhere to the provisions of the Settlement Agreement as signed by the Respondent on June 6, 2006 and by the Board on August 10, 2006, as follows:
 - A. The respondent shall complete the current long-term comprehensive programs for substance abuse and anger management and shall continue to follow the recommendations of these programs.
 - B. The Respondent shall practice under supervision for a period of two years from the date of reinstatement. Supervision is defined as working directly with another Board licensed respiratory care practitioner. The name of the supervising practitioner must be submitted for approval by the Board within 30 days of the effective date of this Reinstatement Order, and within 30 days of any subsequent changes. The Respondent is responsible for ensuring that the supervising practitioner shall report to the Board on a monthly basis detailing the professional and personal behavior of the Respondent.

- C. The Respondent shall submit to random alcohol and/or drug screens for a period of three years. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Reinstatement Order, as further defined below, Respondent shall furnish to the Board's offices a copy of his contract with a substance abuse treatment program that defines the terms for compliance with said random screens, as identified in the State's Assent to Respondent's Motion to Amend Settlement Agreement. Failure to pass a screen shall be reported to the Board immediately.
- D. Respondent shall bear all costs of treatment, evaluation and reporting as required by this *Reinstatement Order*, but he shall be permitted to share such costs with third parties.
- E. Within ten days of the effective date of this Reinstatement Order, as further defined below, Respondent shall furnish a copy of this order to any employer for a period of three years, as stated in the Settlement Agreement.
- F. Respondent's breach of any of the terms of either this Reinstatement Order or the August 10, 2006 Settlement Agreement shall constitute unprofessional conduct pursuant to RSA 328-F: 23, and a separate and sufficient basis for further disciplinary action by the Board.
- G. This *Reinstatement Order* shall take effect as an Order of the Board on the date it is signed by an authorized representative of the Board.
