Who may qualify for this relief? Homeowners who...

- have a principal residence in New Hampshire
- resided in this home (homestead) since April 1, 2010
- have total household income
 - \$20,000 or less, if single, OR
 - \$40,000 or less, if married or head of a NH household
- file a claim by the application **Deadline: June 30, 2011**
(some exceptions if approved by the Commissioner)

If you'd like assistance completing NH Dept of Revenue application Form DP-8, bring:

- Copy of your December Property Tax Bill showing your "net" assessed value and/or your Property Assessment Card with Assessed Value
- Property Tax Credit or Exemption Amounts
- Copy of your 2010 Federal Income Tax Return (& returns for all adult members of your household)
- Social Security Number(s)
- Deed or Trust Documents if applicable
