Highway Maintainers operate and service mechanized highway equipment used for the upkeep of public highways, and to perform highway maintenance activities and emergency traffic services in a highway district or turnpike system of the DOT.

Min. Qualifications (I): Education: Completion of eighth grade or its equivalent and three months of work experience preferably in a field related to highway maintenance.

License/Certification: Applicant must possess a valid driver's license from his/her state of residence. The applicant's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) must meet the minimum standards as established by the hiring agency. The applicant must obtain a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with appropriate endorsements prior to completion of the probationary period.

Min. Qualifications (II): Completion of a two-year high school course, G.E.D. or its equivalent and one year of experience in the operation of light motor driven equipment.

License/Certification: Must possess a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with appropriate endorsements. The applicant's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) must meet the minimum standards as established by the hiring agency.

Special Qualifications: Preference will be given to candidates who possess a high school diploma, G.E.D. or its equivalent

A pre-employment urinalysis drug screen is required.

It is preferred that the applicant live or be willing to relocate within 20 minutes travel time of the assigned patrol headquarters. Applicant must have a telephone or acceptable means of communication and acceptable driving record.
