

## Camps In New Hampshire:

**Specific Disability Camps** may have scholarships; many camps for children also have specific weeks or weekends for adults or families.

**Note:** Although, as a general rule, those camps which are not operated by a religious entity must comply with the Americans With Disabilities Act. These camps are not necessarily accessible for or accommodating of campers with all disabilities, so specific disability-related information should be gathered in order to make the camping experience more enjoyable.
