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PAVEMENT REHABILITATION ON I-89 IN BOW-CONCORD-HOPKINTON
DAYTIME AND NIGHTTIME WORK WILL IMPACT TRAFFIC

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation announces the latest schedule of work on the continuing rehabilitation of Interstate 89 in Bow, Concord and Hopkinton.

Daytime activity from Tuesday, July 30 through Thursday, August 2 will involve northbound work that will include a section of I-89 between Exit 2 and Exit 3, as well as the high speed lane from NH Route 3A to Exit 2. Northbound paving work will begin at approximately 4:30 AM each day, with one lane closed for the work zone. Traffic will be returned to two lanes after 3:00 PM for peak traffic hours. Southbound paving work will include the high-speed lane from NH 3A to Exit 2. Work will begin at 9:00 AM with one lane closed for the work zone. Traffic will be returned to two lanes daily before 6:00 PM.

Nighttime work is planned for Monday, August 6 through Friday, August 10 from 7:00 PM to 6:00 AM each night. The Exit 1 northbound off ramp and all the ramps at Exit 2 (Clinton Street) will be closed on certain nights for paving work. Traffic will be diverted north or south to the next exit to reverse direction while the ramp is closed to traffic.

Motorists using I-89 during these time periods should allow more time to arrive at their destinations. This project is expected to continue for two more months with more weeks of paving planning. Continental Paving of Londonderry, New Hampshire is the contractor for the \$4.7 million project, which has a final completion date of October 2007.

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
