CULVERT CONSTRUCTION ON NH ROUTE 3A IN PLYMOUTH
WORK WILL REQUIRE SINGLE LANE TRAFFIC FOR ONE WEEK

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation announces construction of a large culvert will take place on NH Route 3A in Plymouth approximately 1.5 miles south of the Plymouth Traffic Circle. The work will require single lane traffic through the work zone, which is scheduled to begin Monday, September 10, 2001.

A New Hampshire Department of Transportation crew will restrict traffic through the work zone to a single 12-foot wide lane starting September 10. The restriction is expected to continue for approximately one week until the work is complete.

Plans are to use stop and yield signs, barrels, changeable message signs, portable lighting units and concrete barriers to guide vehicles through the work area. Reduced speed limits through the project limits will also be in effect for the duration of the work. In the event of adverse weather or unanticipated soil conditions, the start and stop dates of the lane restriction may be delayed.

Motorists traveling on NH Route 3A in Plymouth are asked to use caution when driving through the work zone, as workers and equipment will be present. Minor delays may be expected. Because of the short duration of the construction, motorists should be alert to changes in traffic patterns as the work progresses during the week.
