

The New Hampshire State Aeronautical Fund

Ever get an overnight package in the mail or need to get to a destination rapidly? Chances are one of your local airports played a part. You can help preserve NH airports with a tax deductible donation to the Aviation Trust Fund.

In 2011, the NH Legislature approved the establishment of a dedicated State Aeronautical Fund. The purpose is for the funding of maintenance as well as planning and implementation of capital improvements for our 24 "Open for Public Use" airports.

Because of state budget constraints, there has been little to no funding in recent years for those airports that do not receive federal monies. Since some infrastructure needs are becoming critical, the Aeronautical Fund is structured as a dedicated fund to accept donations. Your tax deductible 501 C (3) donation to this fund will allow action to begin at our most critical need NH airports. Identification of these critical airports is the responsibility of the Department of Transportation Bureau of Aeronautics.


