



- Hard costs are generally less expensive in New Hampshire.

- Fly direct to Manchester-Boston Regional Airport on low-cost carriers.
- Great proximity to metropolitan areas. One hour to Boston. Four hours to New York City. Four and a half hours to Montréal, Québec.
- With a 15-member Film Commission made up of industry professionals and representatives from numerous state agencies and associations, filmmakers have access to one-stop shopping.
