

Regional Planning Commissions - Overview

- Nine regional planning commissions (RPCs) in NH;
- Established in RSA 36:47-58 as non-profit quasi-govt. entities; special purpose political subdivisions
- Voluntary member organization governed by representatives from each member town or city
- Purposes:
 - 1. To assist member towns with individual planning,
 - 2. To carry out regional planning,
 - 3. To foster coordination between towns
- Focus on land use, transportation, natural resources
- Advisory role



Site and Municipal Scale Facility Impacts

- Roads and Intersections establish adequate site access; mitigate traffic impacts;
- **Public Safety -** specialized equipment for Fire, Police, EMT; managing large public events;
- Water Supply source water supply (groundwater or surface water) and distribution (lines, pumping stations, controls) to address significant increase in demand;
- **Sewage Disposal** wastewater treatment plant expansion & treatment upgrades; permitting; sewer lines
- Stormwater utilities open and closed drainage

Municipal Services Impacts

- Public Safety-
 - Police: larger force to handle daily population influx, traffic, crime, investigations to provide adequate access; manage traffic impacts;
 - Fire: larger force, specialized equipment, added maintenance
 - EMT: larger force, additional equipment
- Roads increased preservation and maintenance
- Sewage Disposal increased operating costs
- Water Supply increased operating costs
- Stormwater utilities increased maintenance
- Waste Disposal increased disposal costs
- Social Services additional demand for services
- Planning / Permitting /Inspection -- need to establish or expand staff

Regional Impacts

- Employment temporary construction jobs, fulltime service sector jobs added
- **Housing** need for workforce housing in the region expands;
- Transportation
 - Regional highway capacity expansion may be needed; congestion mitigation & management;
 - Development or augmentation of public transportation system
- Water Supply development of new sources, depending on location and adequacy of supply; potential impact on existing municipal sources
- Sewer & Stormwater Treatment impact on impaired waterbodies & required levels of treatment

Regional Impacts - continued

- Land Use & Development:
 - Site: "greenfield" or "brownfield" development?
 - Secondary and induced development;
 - Sprawl effect;
 - Compatibility with area Master Plans; with Regional Master Plan
- Schools from added employment, housing & population in the region
- Regional Economy & Tourism:
 - Expanded visits
 - Change in visit type
 - Change in tourism 'brand'?
 - Impact on unrelated industries
