Consent Order

This Consent Order (“Consent Order”) is made between the New Hampshire Insurance Department (“NHID”) and Dennis Joseph Allen (“the Respondent”), the terms of which are as follows:

- The Respondent is a licensed resident insurance producer. He was first licensed in New Hampshire on September 14, 2011.
- On January 15, 2015, The Respondent pled guilty to felony criminal threatening. The NHID alleges that the respondent violated RSA 402-J:12, I, (a) by failing to disclose a this criminal conviction on his August 24, 2015 license renewal application.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby agreed and ordered:

- The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted, incorporated into and made a part of this Consent Order.
- The Respondent agrees to pay an administrative fine in the amount of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250). The Respondent may pay the fine in two installments according to the following payment schedule: one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125) within ninety (90) days of the Insurance Commissioner’s execution of this Consent Order; and one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125) due within one hundred and eighty (180) days of the execution of this Order.


- The checks must be made payable to "Treasurer, State of New Hampshire," and should be mailed or hand-delivered to the attention of Carolyn Petersen, New Hampshire Insurance Department, 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 14, Concord, New Hampshire 03301.
- In the event that the Respondent fails to meet any of the terms and conditions set forth in the preceding Paragraphs B and C, the NHID may institute proceedings to revoke the Respondent's New Hampshire insurance producer's license based on his failure to comply with those terms and conditions.
- The Respondent acknowledges that by entering into this Consent Order he waives the right to an administrative hearing in which the above-described matters would be adjudicated before a Hearing Officer.
- By entering into this Consent Order and Settlement Agreement, the NHID and the Respondent intend to resolve all issues relating to the above-referenced matters. This Consent Order and Settlement Agreement shall be deemed a complete settlement and full and final resolution, and is in lieu of any other action that could have been brought by the NHID relating to matters disclosed herein.
- This Consent Order and Settlement Agreement shall be fully enforceable in any Superior Court in the State of New Hampshire, and any action to enforce this Consent Order and Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Hampshire.


