**ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
AND
NOTICE OF HEARING**

The New Hampshire Insurance Department (“NHID”) orders Geoffrey N. King (“Respondent”) to show cause why the New Hampshire Insurance Commissioner should not suspend or revoke his New Hampshire insurance claims adjuster license or levy an administrative fine, or both. In support of the Order to Show Cause, and pursuant to RSA 541-A:31, RS 400-A:17 and Ins part 200, the NHID states as follows:

I. STATEMENT OF FACTS

Until October 1, 2014 when his license expired, the Respondent was a nonresident New Hampshire insurance claims adjuster, licensed to adjust property and casualty claims. NHID licensing records indicate the Respondent resides and works in Kansas, which does not license insurance adjusters.

On September 10, 2014, the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri entered Judgment in a Criminal Case against the Respondent. Specifically, the Respondent pled guilty to felony bank fraud for his role in embezzling \$650,659.27 from UMB Bank, N.A.

The conduct of insurance claims adjustors licensed by the NHID is governed by RSA Chapter 402-B. RSA 402-B:12 provides:

The commissioner may for good cause shown, after notice and hearing, suspend or revoke the insurance claims adjuster's license of any holder or subject him to an administrative fine not to exceed \$ 2,500. Such hearing may be held by the commissioner or any person designated by him. Any person aggrieved by said action of the commissioner or refused a license or renewal of the same by him may appeal in accordance with the provisions of RSA 541.

II. STATEMENT OF ISSUE TO BE DECIDED BY HEARING OFFICER

A. Whether, pursuant to RSA 402-B:12, the Respondent's felony bank fraud conviction constitutes "good cause" to suspend or revoke the Respondent's New Hampshire insurance claims adjuster's license or subject him to an administrative fine not to exceed \$ 2,500 or both.

The NHID reserves the right to amend this statement of issues upon reasonable notice to the Commissioner (or his designated Representative) and the Respondent.

III. NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to RSA 541-A:31 and Ins Part 200, the hearing in this matter shall commence at 9:00 a.m. on January 28, 2015 at the offices of the Department, which are located at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 14 in Concord, New Hampshire.

Jennifer Patterson shall preside as the Hearing Officer in this matter.

Sarah Prescott shall serve as clerk to the Hearing Officer. The parties should direct all communications to Ms. Prescott, whose contact information is:

Respondent has the right to be represented by legal counsel at his own expense. Should Respondent elect to retain an attorney, his attorney shall file a Notice of Appearance with Ms.

Prescott, at the earliest possible date. A copy of the Department's Notice of Appearance is enclosed with this Order.



The party requesting a transcript of the proceedings shall file a written request for a certified court reporter with the Hearing Officer at least 10 days prior to the scheduled hearing date. The costs incurred for the services of a certified court reporter shall be borne by the requesting party.


