Gary Haven Smith received his Bachelor of Fine Arts from the University of New Hampshire at Durham. After graduating, he spent time in Italy and Greece exploring sculpture in stone.

Smith's early work was primarily in marble. His more recent work explores the textures and monumental qualities of granite.



Smith has exhibited widely throughout the U.S. His work is represented in many private and public collections including the Currier Museum of Art in Manchester, NH; the Chase Manhattan Bank in New York City; and the Hotel Cosima in Tokyo, Japan. Smith has also received major commissions through New Hampshire's Percent for Art Program.

In 2002, Smith received the first Enrichment Grant ever awarded by the Greater Piscataqua Community Foundation.
