The **NH State Council on the Arts** has a variety of grants available for Academic Year 2016-2017 (FY2017) that support quality **Arts Education and Integrated Arts Learning** in both the regular school day and out-of-school educational settings.

Led by Catherine O'Brian, Arts Education Programs and Grants Coordinator, the workshop will cover the new electronic grant application system; guidelines and criteria; roles of partners; thematic curriculum connections; working with and supporting academic disciplines; choice of artists; writing goals and outcomes; evaluation for improvement; planning residency schedules, final reports and budgets. Several teaching artists and experienced project coordinators will also share their experiences. Certificates of attendance will be given upon completion.

This professional development opportunity is free and open to arts educators, classroom teachers, curriculum coordinators, after school youth leaders, administrators, youth development professionals, parents and teaching artists. This will be a lively and interactive workshop. Teams are encouraged! Pre-registration is required as space is limited. Registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
