# ABOUT THE ARTS BANK

The Arts Bank Collection grew in response to a need to spread limited state art funds to the greatest number of sites possible. The solution was to develop a collection of portable art works that could travel around the state. Thanks to a percentage of funds generated from new construction at the New Hampshire State Prison in 1984, more than 180 works of art were purchased and organized into an exhibition. The exhibition toured for three years, appearing at 22 sites from Dover to Claremont and from Berlin to Nashua. In 1989 the Arts Bank Collection was taken off tour to be distributed to permanent locations around the state.
