Welcome to the 12th year of *Poetry Out Loud* in New Hampshire! Registration is now open!

We are accepting applications to the program from all NH public, private, and charter high schools. Priority will be given to schools that participated last year, until September 9, 2016. New schools will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. The program is limited to 40 schools.

What is Poetry Out Loud?

- A free and fun curricular unit that deeply engages students in our nation's literary heritage through classic poetry.
- An opportunity for your students to compete in school, regional, and state-wide competitions.
- A national model in poetry instruction that is supported by the NH State Council on the Arts, NH Writers Project, National Endowment for the Arts, and the Poetry Foundation.
- A teacher-friendly, flexible program that can be integrated into the English Language Arts curriculum with curriculum materials which support the English Language Arts, History, and Theatre Arts standards.
