Introducing the New Hampshire Folklife website - a resource for teaching and learning about traditional arts and folklife.



Come join us for a day of exploring, discussing and hands-on activities, all centered on the New Hampshire Folklife website.

The NH Folklife website is an easily accessible and engaging resource designed for teachers and students to explore and learn about our state's living heritage.

This workshop is for elementary school teachers interested in exploring ways to integrate folklife and traditional arts into units on social studies, New Hampshire history, arts, technology, and a multi-disciplinary curriculum. A hands-on computer lab session will allow teachers to delve into the newest feature of the website's Learning Center: Heritage Arts Build-A-Picture Activities. These interactive picture puzzles are directed to students grades 3 & up and combine literacy, writing and research activities.



A special feature of this workshop is a participatory session on "Sketching & Heritage Arts" offered by nationally acclaimed book illustrator Karen Busch Holman. The session will introduce teachers to basic sketching techniques and ways that sketching can enhance student learning across the curriculum. Ms. Holman's illustrations will soon be seen on the NH Folklife website. Her publishing credits include illustrations for Marie Harris's children's publications *G is for Granite* and *Primary Numbers: A New Hampshire Numbers Book*.

This workshop is presented by the Traditional Arts Program of the NH State Council on the Arts in conjunction with the Arts Alliance of Northern New Hampshire. Both organizations include in their mission the preservation of our living heritage and cultural life. Funding is from the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.
