

1. Cases representing a conflict of clinical, legal, administrative, or financial conflict.
 2. Cases beyond routine correctional health practice.
 3. Cases posing any extraordinary risk or liability.
 4. Policies needing clarification or interpretation.
- C. If a staff person has a case meeting the above criteria, that staff person should contact the committee chair to be scheduled for presentation.
- D. Cases or policy discussions are heard and discussed with an attempt for consensus among the group. However, in matters involving specific cases, practitioners need only take the recommendation under advisement.
