I. **PURPOSE:**

To provide a policy and procedure for inmates who are foreign nationals to have access to the diplomatic representative of their country of citizenship.

II. **APPLICABILITY:**

To all inmates who are citizens of countries other than the United States of America, Classification Staff and Wardens.

III. **POLICY:**

It is the policy of the New Hampshire Department of Corrections that inmates who are citizens of other countries be made aware of their right to contact a representative of their country of citizenship.

IV. **PROCEDURE:**

- A. During the initial quarantine period as part of the classification process, the Classification Staff will orally inform foreign nationals of their right to contact their diplomatic representative.
- B. The inmate will be referred to their Case Counselor/Case Manager for assistance in contacting their diplomatic representative.
