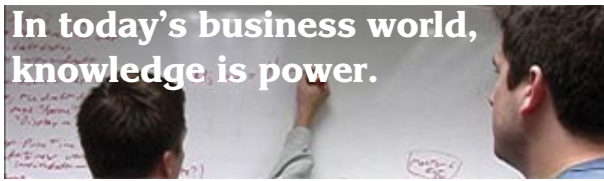

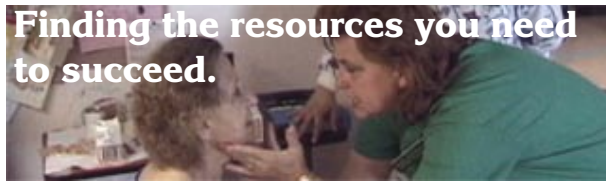

Putting these resources to work for you.

Here are some other ways you can use labor market information:

- Do your employees need a state-issued license, certification, or registration? Get information on requirements, contacts, fees, and more.
- Are you trying to assess business growth trends? *NH Employment Projections by Occupation and Industry* projects changes in employment over the next ten years.
- Applying for a grant? Get statistics for grant applications, such as population or industry employment levels.
- Planning to recruit new employees? Use commuting patterns to determine where people who work in your area reside.
- Do your employees need training? Are you interested in sponsoring cooperative education or student interns? Get information on educational institutions who may offer in-house training classes, cooperative education programs, or student intern placements.
