**Response from the State of New Hampshire to a Request for More Information  
Regarding Historic Preservation and Waste Stream**

- I. As currently proposed, New Hampshire's EECBG proposal does not involve a building or site that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. However, the New Hampshire Office of Energy and Planning (OEP) foresees a potential that applicants for EECBG subgrants might propose projects that will involve a building or site that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. OEP will require all applicants for subgrants to supply the following information if their proposals involve a building or site listed on the National Register of Historic Places:

*For proposed activities that involve buildings (structures, or facilities) listed on the National Register of Historic Places, or buildings that may be eligible for listing, please provide, in addition to the information requested in Item 5 of NETL F 451.1-1/3-EECBG, the age of the building, as well as copies of any existing documentation relative to consultation/communication you may have already conducted with the State Historic Preservation Officer.*

- II. As currently proposed, New Hampshire's EECBG proposal does not involve a project that would generate a waste stream. However, the New Hampshire Office of Energy and Planning (OEP) foresees a potential that applicants for EECBG subgrants might propose projects that will involve a project that would generate a waste stream. OEP will require all applicants for subgrants to supply the following information if their proposals involve a project that would generate a waste stream:

*For proposed projects or activities that would generate a waste stream, in addition to the information requested, describe the waste and your methodology for waste handling and disposal. For example would window glass be recycled or disposed in a local sanitary waste facility? How would mercury or sodium vapor lamps be disposed? How will potentially hazardous materials (e.g. asbestos containing materials, PCBs, etc.) be handled and disposed?*

In general, the New Hampshire Office of Energy and Planning (OEP) foresees a potential that applicants for EECBG subgrants might propose projects that will require approval under NEPA. OEP will utilize the "Table of NEPA Requirements by EECBG Project Activities" provided in the EECBG Funding Opportunity Announcement to guide subgrant applicants regarding the potential for NEPA review.
