## MOTION TO DISMISS

The Board, meeting at its offices in Concord, New Hampshire, on April 9, 1996, took the following actions:

- It reviewed the Association's unfair labor practice (ULP) complaint filed March 5, 1996, the City's Answer and Motion to Dismiss filed March 20, 1996, and the Association's Motion for Summary Judgment filed April 8, 1996.
- 2. It convened a hearing to take evidence and hear testimony relating to the pending ULP complaint.
- 3. It heard opening arguments from representatives for each party on their Motions for Summary Judgment and to Dismiss, respectively.
- 4. At the conclusion of those arguments, the Board deliberated thereon and entertained the following:

Based on the current collective bargaining agreement, we find no provision allowing the Manchester Police Patrolman's Association to challenge the change of the Manchester Police Department's Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and, therefore, move to grant the Motion to Dismiss.

5. By vote of two to one, it GRANTED the Motion to Dismiss.
