ORDER TO COMPLY

The PELRB heard the two above-captioned consolidated cases and thereafter rendered Decision Nos. 1997-101 and 1997-124 on November 19, 1997 and December 19, 1997, respectively. These matters were then appealed to and heard by the New Hampshire Supreme Court under its Docket No. 98-038 and remanded on the issue of directing a remedy appropriate with the Court's decision of November 23, 1999. On December 29, 1999, the PELRB, consistent with independent requests from counsel for the parties, remanded this matter to the arbitrator below for action consistent with the order of the Court in Docket No. 98-038. See PELRB Decision No. 1999-131.

By filing of October 31, 2000, the employer sought a Motion to Dismiss as to Case Nos. M-0596:10 and M-0596:11. Item 4 of that motion states, *inter alia*, that "to date, the Union has not made arrangements with the Arbitrator to hear the remaining issues in the case." The Union's answer to the foregoing motion, filed on November 7, 2000, only objects thereto and offers no denial of its alleged failure to pursue arbitration as directed by Decision No. 1999-131.

The Union is hereby accorded a period of thirty (30) days from the date hereof to schedule the arbitration proceedings contemplated by PELRB Decision No. 1999-131 and to supply written evidence thereof to the PELRB in the form of a copy of the Arbitrator's scheduling notice. If said evidence is not filed with the PELRB, in written form, before the close of business on December 14, 2000, these matters shall thereafter be administratively dismissed from the PELRB's docket of cases.
