Order

On October 13, 2011 the Londonderry Administrative Employees Association, Affiliated with AFSCME, Council 93 filed an agreed upon petition to modify the existing bargaining unit by dividing the existing unit into two separate units and by adding positions to each of the proposed new units. The proposed units are as follows:

Unit A (certain public safety administrative employees):

Police Captain, Police Lieutenant, Police Administrative Secretary, Police Executive Secretary, Fire Marshall, Fire Captain, Fire Executive Secretary

Unit B (certain town administrative employees):

Appraiser, Environmental Engineer, Public Works Administrative Assistant, GIS Mgr/Planner, Assistant Building Inspector/Deputy Health Officer, Assistant Assessor, Assistant Public Works Director, Administrative Support Coordinator, Town Planner, Public Information Coordinator/Assistance Director Londonderry Access Center, Training Coordinator, Senior Building Inspector/Health and Zoning Officer.


No objections, exceptions, or petitions to intervene have been filed in this case.

On November 30, 2011 the AFSCME Londonderry Administrative Employees Association (AFSCME/LAEA) filed a petition for certification seeking a secret ballot election to determine the exclusive representative, if any, a proposed bargaining unit consisting of the positions set forth in Unit B and with the exclusion of certain additional positions not germane here. See PELRB Case No. G-0182-1. The Town has agreed to the composition of the proposed bargaining unit set forth in Case No. G-0182-1. No objections, exceptions, or petitions to intervene have been filed in Case No. G-0182-1, and orders approving the proposed bargaining unit and requiring the conduct of a secret ballot election have issued simultaneous with this decision.

Accordingly, the modification petition is granted and the existing bargaining unit is modified to consist of the positions set forth above in Unit A and an amended certification shall issue. The Unit B positions described above are now the subject of the related petition for certification. Further PELRB proceedings concerning Unit B positions will be as set forth in orders issued in Case No. G-0182-1.
