<u>Order</u>

On November 20, 2017, the State filed an agreed upon petition for modification pursuant to N.H. Admin. Rule Pub 302.05. In its petition the State seeks to modify the existing certification of the New Hampshire Sweepstakes Commission bargaining unit, PELRB Decision No. 2004-048 (May 6, 2004), to reflect "the name and composition changes of the agency made by RSA 284:6-a and RSA 284:21-a." See State Modification Petition at 7. The State seeks to update the name of the Sweepstake Commission to the Lottery Commission and to modify the Lottery Commission unit description to include the classified employees of the former Pari-Mutuel Commission and eliminate the Pari-Mutuel Racing Commission unit, set forth in PELRB Decision No. 2004-047 (May 6, 2004). The State asserts that the Pari-Mutuel Racing Commission "no longer exists and its functions have been transferred to the Lottery

Commission." See State Modification Petition at 7. The Union assents to the petition. No exceptions, objections, or petitions to intervene have been filed in this case.

The petition for modification is hereby granted. Accordingly, a unit modification order shall issue forthwith and shall contain the following description of the bargaining unit consisting of current employees of the Lottery Commission (formerly employees of Sweepstakes and Pari-Mutuel Commissions).

Unit:

All classified employees of the Lottery Commission with the exception of those classified employees excluded from the definition of public employee under the provisions of RSA 273-A:1, IX.
