What is the Med Bank?

The New Hampshire Med Bank is a charitable pharmacy that collects unused, unexpired, non-controlled medications from licensed healthcare facilities and dispenses them at no cost to NH residents who cannot afford their medications. The pharmacy operations are overseen by the Pharmacist-in-Charge, who is supported by a team of volunteer pharmacists and pharmacy technicians. The NH Med Bank team dispenses medications by mail to qualifying patients.



What medications are available?

The Med Bank collects a large variety of medications that are **non-controlled** and **unexpired**. The Med Bank does **NOT** carry insulin or other refrigerated items.

How does a patient access the Med Bank?

Contact your local Medication Bridge Program, which is a volunteer network that assists low-income patients with access to prescription medications. All patients must meet with a Medication Bridge staff member and provide their prescriptions to see if they qualify. Visit Healthynh.com for a statewide listing or call **(603) 225-0900**.

How many medications can I get?

If a patient meets with a Medication Bridge staff member and qualifies for medication, the NH Med Bank will dispense what is available in the inventory with a valid prescription.



Can I donate medications?

The Med Bank only accepts donations from licensed healthcare facilities in New Hampshire and does **NOT** accept medications from individuals. If you work for a facility that may be interested in donating please contact the NH Med Bank program coordinator at **(603) 415-4258**.
