On December 21, 2005, representatives from Northeast Recycling, as noted above, presented a proposed protocol (pilot program) which could be used, in New Hampshire, for the collection and destruction of unwanted prescription (and non-prescription) medications from the public.

By consensus, the Board agreed that although NRC's protocol for the collection and destruction of unwanted prescription drugs may be permissible in New Hampshire, the Board was concerned with the convoluted collection and destruction logistics as described by the Council's representatives. Accordingly, the Board does not endorse and/or support the proposal at this time.
