#### III. Division / BEMS Reports

Item 1. Division and BEMS Updates - Reported by Bureau Chief Justin Romanello

- a. Back to pre-covid operations. Classes are run at full capacity, optional mask use and 6 feet socially distant recommendations. Effective June 1<sup>st</sup>, all Board meetings will be back in person. A quorum must be physically present.
- b. The potential New Director is a retired Hampton Deputy Chief, Justin Cutting. Went to the Governor's Office and will be pushed to Governor & Council for final approval and bar any issues.
- c. April 30<sup>th</sup> was the end of licensing period. The process went smoothly with the new system, Respond NH. Generally the Division loses about 300 providers, but gain about 300 as well. This year, the Division lost an additional 200 providers.
- d. Last 3 electrostatic sprayers are finally gone. Tablets are still at the Academy if departments/units are in need of them.
- e. Final numbers for the FROST program resulted in identifying 70 responders that were asymptomatic, but tested positive for Covid-19.

# <u>Item 2.</u> Legislative Report –Chief Justin Romanello

- a. SB 143 has moved past the Executive session, this will be heard at the House meeting. This is regarding data sharing.
- a. SB 133 is an omnibus bill, the Executive session is next Tuesday. This is in regards to the repeal of replica and just culture. Significant discussion of repealing replica opposed to it and in support of it has been seen. Supporting Just Culture has been recognized, hasn't seen much, if anything about opposing this
