To remind, the question I'd like answered is what Maryam meant when she told me that Michele would have been fired had she told me the actual number of complaints against FRM or if she had told me anything else except that there had been only one complaint against them. She said there was a statute that explained that, but I asked her in my subsequent email for that statute and have not gotten no response.
