BRIDGE WORK ON NH ROUTE 3A IN MANCHESTER WILL IMPACT TRAFFIC
TWO WEEKS OF STEEL SETTING IS PART OF AIRPORT ACCESS ROAD PROJECT

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation announces the planned setting of structural steel for a new bridge over NH Route 3A in Manchester will begin on Monday, March 30, weather permitting, and will require alternating one way traffic and occasional temporary road closures.

This bridge steel beam work will take place daily between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM and will take approximately two weeks to complete. A total of 12 steel beams will be put in place on the new bridge, which is part of the Manchester Airport Access Road project. Uniformed officers will alert motorists to the traffic pattern and the temporary road closures, and assist them through the work zone.

This bridge project is part of a \$30.3 million segment of the Access Road being constructed by Beck & Bellucci, Inc. of Franklin, New Hampshire.

The new Manchester Airport Access Road will provide full access to and from the F.E. Everett Turnpike in Bedford and the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport. The \$126 million project has a final completion date of 2013.
