







MULTI-STATE PERMITS MAY BE OBTAINED ONLY FOR VEHICLES AND LOADS FALLING WITHIN THE SIZE ENVELOPE LIMITS AS FOLLOWS AND SHOWN TO RIGHT

Maximum Limits

Weight: 100,000 lbs. on five axle units
120,000 lbs. on six or more axle units
Attention: Note special axle weight and axle spacing requirements shown under NETC Envelope Vehicle Configurations.

Length: 90'-0"
Height: 13'-6"
Width: 14'-0"

* (additional 6" of overhang for eaves on mobile and modular home components only is permissible)

FOR VEHICLES EXCEEDING ABOVE ENVELOPE LIMITS INDIVIDUAL STATE PERMITS MUST BE OBTAINED FROM EACH STATE PERMIT OFFICE.

TO OBTAIN MULTI-STATE PERMIT, CONTACT STATE PERMIT OFFICE IN DESTINATION STATE, EXCEPT FOR TRIPS WITH DESTINATION OUTSIDE AGREEMENT STATES WHERE ORIGIN STATE OR ENTRY STATE PERMIT OFFICE WILL ISSUE PERMIT.



MAXIMUM SIZE LIMITS:


LENGTH: 90'-0" OR LESS
HEIGHT: 13'-6" OR LESS
WIDTH: 14'-0" OR LESS

* FOR MODULAR AND MOBILE HOMES, AN ADDITIONAL 6 INCHES OF OVERHANG FOR EAVES ONLY WILL BE ALLOWED PROVIDING THE GREATER OVERHANG IS ON THE RIGHT-HAND SHOULDER SIDE OF THE HIGHWAY



MAXIMUM GROSS WEIGHT LIMITS:

100,000 LBS. ON VEHICLES WITH FIVE AXLES
120,000 LBS. ON VEHICLES WITH SIX OR MORE AXLES
(SEE MINIMUM AXLE SPACING AND MAXIMUM AXLE WEIGHTS BELOW)



NOTE: VEHICLES WITH THE TANDEM AND TRIDEM AXLES INTERCHANGED ARE ACCEPTABLE UNDER THE SAME AXLE SPACING AND WEIGHT GUIDELINES.

AXLE WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS:

MAX. WEIGHT ON SINGLE AXLE = 25K EXCEPT FOR STEERING AXLE:
MAX. WEIGHT ON STEERING AXLE = 12K MAX., 6K MIN.
MAX. WEIGHT ON TANDEM = 25K/AXLE
MAX. WEIGHT ON TRIDEM = 20K/AXLE

OTHER RESTRICTIONS:

- RETRACTABLE AXLES SHALL NOT BE COUNTED AS AXLES NOR SHALL THEY BE CONSIDERED CAPABLE OF CARRYING ANY LOAD.
- MAXIMUM WEIGHT ON TIRES SHALL NOT EXCEED 600 LBS. PER INCH OF NOMINAL TIRE WIDTH.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Driver to carry permit and regulations. No movement shall be started until a permit therefore has been issued. The driver shall carry the permit and a copy of this section in the permitted vehicle and shall have same available for inspection by any police officer or representative of the Department/Agency empowered to issue such permit.
- Permit limited to single trip.
 - A permit shall be valid only for a single trip in one direction between the two points designated. A single trip permit shall expire after five authorized weekdays have lapsed as specified on the permit.
 - The permit shall not authorize a return trip unless requested and specifically indicated on the permit.
- Posted weight limits. The permit shall not supersede any lesser weight limit posted on a bridge or highway.
- Scope of permit. The granting of a permit shall not be considered as a guarantee of the sufficiency of any highway or structure thereon for the load authorized.
- Additional restrictions. The permittee shall comply with all applicable statutes and regulations of the individual states and any political subdivision thereof, unless specifically exempted by the permit.
- Highway restrictions.
 - The permit shall authorize movement only on the pavement portion of those highways specified in the permit which are on the state highway systems. The permit does not authorize movement upon shoulders or on the Mass. and Maine Turnpikes. For permits from Turnpike Authorities, stop at toll station upon entering turnpike. A copy of the multi-state permit will probably be required to secure permit for Turnpike travel.
 - Permission must be obtained from local authorities for the use of local roads and streets (which are listed in brackets or parentheses on the permit).
- Inclement weather. No travel is allowed when road conditions, weather conditions, or visibility make traveling hazardous to the operator or to the driving public. Vehicles which are underway when inclement weather occurs must exit the road at the first available location and park in a safe place until the weather abates, or until the road conditions improve.
- Days of Travel. Permit travel is authorized during approved hours on Monday through Friday. Permit travel is not authorized on Saturdays or Sundays or the Holidays as listed below. A blank space under specific state signifies no restriction in that state.

SPECIAL NOTE: Holidays falling on Saturday will be observed on the preceding Friday. Holidays falling on Sunday will be observed on the following Monday.

- Hours of Travel. Permit vehicles may travel on designated routes during daylight from 30 minutes prior to sunrise until 30 minutes after sunset except those routes shown in red on map on reverse side. Permit moves are authorized on red routes only before 7:00 a.m. (if daylight) and between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. No moves are allowed between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. or after 3:30 p.m. on the red routes. No night-time travel is authorized except for envelope vehicles which are overweight only and capable of traveling with the normal traffic flow.

- Use of Travel Lanes. When two or more lanes are available in one direction, vehicles in excess of 12'-0" wide shall travel in the right lane, except in an emergency or to comply with any other restriction established by the state in which they are traveling.
- Damage to highway. The permittee shall repair at his own expense and to the satisfaction of the highway agency any avert damage to highways or structures which occurs in connection with operations under the permit.
- Flags. Red or orange fluorescent warning flags at least 18 inches square shall be required on all overdimension loads. All warning flags shall be secured by at least one corner or mounted on a staff.
 - Overwidth loads shall have at least two (2) and up to six (6) flags mounted at the widest extremity and the corners of the load.
 - Overlength loads or loads with rear or front end overhang in excess of four (4') feet shall display one flag at the end of the overhang if less than two (2') feet wide, and two flags if the overhang is over two (2') feet wide.
- Signs for Oversize Loads. Two warning signs reading "OVERSIZE LOAD" shall be in evidence during all movements and placed on front and rear of haul vehicle and load. Warning signs shall be at least 7 feet long and 18 inches high with yellow background and black lettering. Letters should be at least 10 inches high with a 1.6 inch brush stroke. Vehicles and loads exceeding a 15'-0" front-end overhang should be required to display one sign with the wording "OVERSIZE LOAD". This sign should be on the front of the vehicle.

Vehicle and loads exceeding legal length or rear overhang should be required to display two signs with the wording "OVERSIZE LOAD". One sign should be on the rear of the overlength or overhanging part of the load; however, if the sign cannot be attached or is not legible here, then the sign should be attached to the rear of the vehicle itself. The other sign should be attached to the front of the vehicle.

Escort vehicles should display a sign reading "OVERSIZE LOAD" that is at least five feet long and 12 inches high with ten inch high letters.
- Lights. Load hauling vehicles and escort vehicles shall travel with low beam headlights on at all times. Escort vehicles shall display flashing yellow (amber) lights to front and rear at an elevation above the highest point of the escort vehicle.
- Escort Vehicles. One escort vehicle is required for overall widths of 12'-0" or more, overall length of 80'-0" or more, or overhang of 15'-0" or more. The number of escort vehicles is specified on permit. Escort vehicle shall precede load on undivided highways and follow load on divided highways unless otherwise specified on permit.
- Spacing Between Permitted Vehicles. A minimum of 1,000 feet is required between oversize loads traveling in same direction.
- Speed. Permit vehicles shall travel at safe speed and obey any special speed restrictions for permit vehicles by the states.
- Invalidation of permit. The permit shall be subject to confiscation by the violation of any condition specified therein or by the violation. The permit shall be automatically invalidated by the giving of false information on the permit application.
- Liability. The permittee shall pay any claim for personal injury or property damage arising out of his operation under the permit for which he shall be determined to be legally responsible and shall fully indemnify, defend, if requested, and save harmless the State and any Department, officer, and employee thereof from any suit, action or claim against them arising out of such operations.

- Special Conditions and Requirements in addition to time of day restrictions shown on map (reverse side), the following shall also apply:
 - Maine
 - Mass. - For permitted Massachusetts registered vehicles traveling in Massachusetts, the vehicle must be registered for the total gross weight.
 - N. H.
 - R.I. - A truck using Rhode Island highways must have on file an insurance certificate number in the Permit Office.
 - Vermont - Each registered truck using Vermont highways must display a Vermont fuel decal or plate; the vehicle must have on file an insurance certificate number for oversize and/or overweight vehicles only.
