



Coordination Model



Coordination Strategies

- Centralized information and referrals
- One stop access for trip planning
- Increased use of transit passes
- Mileage reimbursement
- Travel voucher programs
- Taxi subsidy programs and wheelchair accessible taxis
- Centralized volunteer driver, escort, or bus buddy programs
- Sharing of policies, practices, and resources among service providers
- Joint procurement of fuel, maintenance, insurance, and equipment


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Can I Get There?



Individuals with limited access to transportation cannot fully participate in community life.

What is Community Transportation?

Any services that address all transit needs of a community, including general and special populations, such as

- Seniors
- Persons with disabilities
- Persons with low income
- The public at large

Why is Community Transportation Important?

Residents of New Hampshire need access to employment, health care, education, community services, and other activities that are necessary for daily living.

What are the Mobility & Access Problems?

- No transportation available
- Lack of information
- Critical destinations unserved
- Limited schedules
- Restricted eligibility for services
- Confusing array of programs
- Private options unaffordable
- Limited funds to expand services

What is Coordination?

Ways in which organizations can work together to share information and resources in providing transportation to those people who rely on community transportation services.

New Hampshire's Coordination Strategy

Many states have improved transportation through a coordinated system that

- Improves cost efficiency
- Improves service quality
- Provides more service

The New Hampshire State Legislature created the **State Coordinating Council for Community Transportation** to foster and guide the coordination of community transportation on the regional level.

The Regional Coordinating Councils develop coordination strategies in the ten Community Transportation Regions and select Regional Transportation Coordinators (RTC) to implement the strategies in each region.
