# About the Laconia Courthouse

The Laconia Courthouse, housing both the Laconia District Court and the Belknap County Family Division, was originally constructed as a high school for the City of Laconia on the site of the Gilford Academy near the Winnipesaukee River. It is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.
