



**2011 SCRAP
Archaeology Field School
Survey and Test Excavations
At the Jefferson VI
Paleoindian Site
June 27 – August 5
Jefferson, NH**

The 2011 NH State Conservation and Rescue Archaeology Program summer field school will take place at a newly discovered Paleoindian site located in Jefferson, NH. The investigations will consist of site testing with small block excavations and additional survey and mapping to fully identify the size of the site.

Participants in the field school will document the site with detailed excavations and place it in a context with other Paleoindian sites in the immediate vicinity and the broader region. They will also have an opportunity to assist with public outreach by presentations to the general public and site tours.

Participants will learn fundamental recovery and documentation techniques as well as basic artifact identification and field laboratory procedures. Hands-on instruction in the field will be supplemented by background readings, evening lectures by various affiliated scholars, and field trips to nearby Paleoindian sites.

The field school will take place in three 2 week sessions, June 26 – July 8, July 10 - July 22, and July 24 – August 5, 2011. Fieldwork will take place from 8 AM to 4 PM weekdays.

A field camp will be based in nearby Randolph, NH for participants 18 and older during the field school. Those electing to use the field camp will need to provide their own tents and camping gear. A cabin with large kitchen facilities will be used for communal meal preparation. Transportation will be arranged from the field camp to the field school site.

The field school is directed by State Archaeologist Dr. Richard A. Bosivert in cooperation with Plymouth State University, Plymouth, NH.

ACADEMIC CREDIT

Participants may obtain academic credit through Plymouth State University at either the undergraduate or graduate levels. Each week of participation is equivalent to one credit, and students may register for two to six credits. Credit students will be evaluated on their participation in field and laboratory work, plus completion of a research project. Costs for the field school credit students includes a \$50 equipment and supplies fee, plus tuition and registration fees. Undergraduate In-State \$320/credit, Out-of-State \$350/credit plus a \$34 registration fee; Graduate In-State \$493/credit, Out-of-State \$539/credit plus a \$34 registration fee.
