EXECUTIVE COUNCIL CONFIRMS JEFFREY WHITE AS DIRECTOR OF FIELD SERVICES

Concord, NH – On December 7, 2022, the New Hampshire Executive Council unanimously confirmed the appointment of Jeffrey White as the Director of Field Services for the Department of Corrections. Governor Sununu nominated White on November 22, 2022.

White joins the Department of Corrections after spending most of his career in law enforcement with over 25 years within the US Marshal's Service. His experience in the justice system includes fugitive investigations, law enforcement interviewing, threat investigations and witness security with areas of expertise in judicial protection prisoner processing, conducting briefings, and service of criminal/civil process. In addition, Mr. White has led many focused trainings for the Marshal Service which he will bring with him as he assists in continuing to advance training resources, opportunities and new innovations into the NH Department of Corrections Probation Parole Officer training curricula. His experience brings multiple law enforcement agencies together with the NH Joint Fugitive Task Force and will be put to effective use in this position.

“Mr. White was instrumental in establishing the ‘Fugitive of the Week’ program in New Hampshire which included fugitives from NH Probation and Parole. He is a strong collaborator, sound leader and informed decision maker,” said Commissioner Helen Hanks. “Jeff is a welcomed new member to our team and his experience will help lead our Field Services team toward even more success.”

The New Hampshire Department of Corrections was established in 1983 and will be marking 40 years as an agency in 2023. The Department's mission is to reduce recidivism by providing safe, humane supervision and evidence-based rehabilitation to enhance public safety in New Hampshire. The Division of Field Services provides supervision to individuals placed on probation, parole, and administrative home confinement as well as conducts pre-sentencing investigations and annulments. Field Services is also responsible for the collection of fines, fees, and restitution.
