TEMPORARY CEASE AND DESIST ORDER

The Board, meeting at its offices in Concord, New Hampshire, on October 27, 1992, took the following actions:

- 1. It reviewed the Union's Unfair Labor Practice (ULP) charges dated July 15, 1992 inclusive of its request for a Cease and Desist order to stop employer-ordered mandatory drug testing and the Authority's Answer dated August 3, 1992.
- 2. It reviewed pre-hearing correspondence exchanged between counsel and provided to the PELRB.
- 3. It heard and considered opening arguments made by each side to these proceedings and entertained their joint stipulation to accept a temporary cease and desist order pending a determination by the Office of the Attorney General of the State of New Hampshire as to the applicability of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (49 CFR 391.41-391.49) and RSA 200:37 effective June 19, 1992 to members of the Union's bargaining unit.
- 4. It determined that the following Temporary Cease and Desist Order shall issue:
 - a) The Authority is to Cease and Desist forthwith from conducting drug testing as a part of the regular two-year physical

examination cycle utilized for members of the Union's bargaining unit, pending a determination by the Office of the Attorney General as to the applicability of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations and RSA 200:37 on bargaining unit personnel.

- b) The parties will submit an inquiry to the Office of the Attorney General seeking a status report on the ruling which they are seeking.
- This Order shall remain in effect until December 31, 1992.
- d) At any time during the pendency of this Order either party may move to reactivate this case or the Board's docket of cases by requesting a hearing.
