## AMENDED ORDER TO BARGAIN

The Board, meeting at its offices in Concord, New Hampshire, on February 28, 1995, took the following actions:

1. At the request of the parties, it reviewed its bargaining order contained in the last paragraph of its decision (Decision No. 95-05) involving them as issued January 19, 1995.
2. It heard the parties' joint and respective representations 1) that they had sought and obtained the services of mediator Richard Higgins for Saturday, March 25, 1995, 2) that further negotiations were unlikely to produce a settlement until the services of a mediator might be utilized, and 3) that they both agreed that there was no need for further negotiating sessions between February 28, 1995 and the established mediation date of March 25, 1995.
3. It accepted the parties' joint motion to be relieved from the obligation of weekly bargaining sessions for the period between February 28, 1995 and March 25, 1995.
4. It GRANTED the parties' motion to be relieved of the obligation to engage in weekly bargaining sessions until the expiration of a period of two (2) weeks after the conclusion of the mediation proceedings scheduled to start on March 25, 1995. If the parties have not reached and had ratified a settlement within two weeks after the conclusion of the March 25, 1995 mediation session(s), then, at the expiration of said two week period, they shall resume bargaining each Saturday and Sunday thereafter as is more particularly described and directed in Decision 95-05, issued January 19, 1995.
