## PRE-HEARING MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

## **BACKGROUND**

The Fall Mountain Teachers Association (hereinafter "the Association") filed a Modification Petition with the Public Employee Labor Relations Board (PELRB), on August 19, 2003, seeking to include Junior ROTC instructors into an existing bargaining unit.

The Fall Mountain School Board (hereinafter "the Employer") filed its objection on September 2, 2003. Its stated objections are based upon several grounds, including the allegation that the salaries of the instructors are set by the United States Army and that the instructors are otherwise subject to dissimilar educational requirements, employment contracts and other benefit levels than the employees in the existing bargaining unit.

#### LENGTH OF HEARING

The time being set aside for this hearing is one day. If either party believes that additional time is required, written notice of the need for additional time shall be filed with the PELRB at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the evidentiary hearing.

## **DECISION**

- 1. The parties' representatives shall meet, or otherwise confer, on or before November 12, 2003 in order to compose a mutual statement of agreed facts and to further explore whether they may be able to reach a settlement of the instant matter.
- 2. In the event that the parties are able to agree to certain relevant facts, then they shall memorialize those facts upon which they can so stipulate and file that document with the PELRB at least five (5) days prior to the date of the hearing.
- 3. The party representatives shall forward any amendments to, or deletions from, their Witness and Exhibit lists, as detailed above, to the opposing representative, and to the PELRB, at least five (5) days prior to the scheduled hearing date. The party representatives shall meet, or otherwise arrange, to pre-mark any exhibits, for identification, prior to the time of hearing and have sufficient copies available for distribution at the hearing as required by Pub 203.02.
- 4. The parties shall file any additional preliminary, procedural or dispositive motions no later than fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the scheduled hearing date.
- 5. Unless otherwise ordered as a result of the filing of any subsequent motion or for other good cause shown, an evidentiary hearing between the parties will be held on:

#### December 1, 2003 at 9:30 AM

at the offices of the Public Employee Labor Relations Board, Concord, New Hampshire.
