MODIFICATION OF CERTIFIED BARGAINING UNIT

A representation proceeding having been previously conducted by the Public Employee Labor Relations Board in accordance with RSA 273-A, and the Rules and Regulations of the Board, which resulted in the selection of an exclusive representative, and where the parties have now stipulated to a modification of the certified bargaining unit's composition, said stipulation being in conformity with the provisions of RSA 273-A; then,

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Board by the Public Employee Labor Relations Act, IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that AFSCME Local 3657, Hollis Police and Fire Employees, is the exclusive representative of the employees of the above named public employer, in the unit as described below, for purposes of collective negotiations and settlement of grievances.

UNIT: All non-probationary full and part-time employees in the Fire, Communications, and Police Department in the following positions: Fire Lieutenant, Firefighter/Paramedic, Firefighter, Communications Specialist, Communications Supervisor, Detective/Sergeant, Sergeant, Detective, School Resource Officer, Police Officer, Civilian Police Aide, and Animal Control Officer. EXCLUDED: Chief of Police, Fire Chief, Police Lieutenant, Communications Manager, Secretary to the Chief, and all other supervisors, professional and confidential employees, persons in a probationary or temporary status, employed seasonally irregularly or on call.

Further, IT IS ORDERED that the above named public employer shall negotiate collectively with the exclusive representative named herein on terms and conditions of employment for the members of the bargaining unit, as herein described, and shall recognize the right of such exclusive representative to represent employees in the settlement of grievances.
