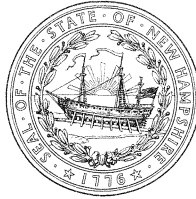

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IMPORTANT NOTICE CONCERNING SALE AND USE OF ALTERNATIVE FUELS

Dear Potential Alternative Fuel Dealer (AFD):

On January 1, 2015, Chapter 268, Laws of 2014, relative to the road toll for alternative fuels, will take effect. This act makes it unlawful for any person to sell or use alternative fuel upon which the road toll imposed and collected under RSA 260 has not been paid, unless the person is a holder of a valid license to engage in business as a dealer of alternative fuels. In order to be in compliance with said act, anyone engaged in this type of business must be licensed prior to January 1, 2015.

FAQ

1. How do I obtain an AFD license application?

The AFD license application, bond application, and trading partner agreement can be downloaded from <http://www.nh.gov/safety/divisions/administration/roadtoll/>.

2. What types of alternative fuel are subject to road toll and related reporting requirements?

The definition of alternative fuel per RSA 259:3-d is "any source of fuel, other than motor fuel and electricity, used to propel a motor vehicle over the ways of the state. Alternative fuel shall include, but not be limited to, compressed natural gas, liquefied natural gas, and propane."

3. What is a motor fuel equivalent gallon?

Motor fuel equivalent gallon is defined by RSA 259:58-b as "the volume of alternative fuel it takes to equal the energy content of one gallon of gasoline or special fuel." Applicable conversion rates will be adopted by the commissioner of safety under RSA 260:57 for motor fuel equivalent gallons for compressed natural gas, liquid natural gas, and propane based on nationally recognized standards for weights and measures.

4. When do I need to begin filing and remitting alternative fuels road toll?

The first monthly AFD Report must be filed by February 20, 2015 on report form "AFD 1" for the gallons sold or dispersed during the month of January 2015. The "AFD 1" can be downloaded at <http://www.nh.gov/safety/divisions/administration/roadtoll/>.
