**Lawrence A. Volz Memorial
Emergency Medical Services Heroism Award**

History: The New Hampshire Emergency Medical Services Memorial Heroism Award is named after Newington Firefighter/EMT Lawrence A. Volz who was killed in a line of duty death in 1971. While transporting a patient to a local hospital, Volz suffered a heart attack at the wheel of the emergency vehicle. The patient and EMT Volz were killed and three other EMS Providers attending the patient were injured. 1997 was the first year that this award was presented.

Purpose: The Award has been created to recognize a New Hampshire EMS Provider for an act(s) of heroism while in the line of duty.

Presentation: The Award will be presented by a member of the EMS Medical & Trauma Coordinating Board at an annual public Emergency Medical Services System function.

Nominations: Licensed EMS Units, New Hampshire Hospital EMS Coordinators and associated organizations shall be notified once per year that the nominations for the Award are being accepted by the Awards Committee. The deadline for nominations shall be determined by the Bureau of EMS and only nominations received by that deadline will be considered.

Awards Committee: The Awards Committee shall be made up of a minimum of two Bureau employees, a member of the EMS Medical Control Board, a member of the EMS Medical & Trauma Coordinating Board and a member of the Newington Fire Department. These members shall review all nominations, decide on the recipient(s) and arrange for the award presentation.

Criteria for Nomination: Nominations can be made for any New Hampshire EMS Provider(s) who have performed an act of heroism in the line of duty. Documentation should be limited to two typed pages and should accompany the nomination form.
