NFPA 1033 is smaller & sometimes an overlooked standard which discusses the professional qualifications for investigators.

The 2014 standard discusses various tasks, job performance requirements, and post secondary educational requirements the investigator should possess.

It may be necessary in the future to assure documentation and compliance with the standard if questioned if you meet the requirements and are in compliance with the standard.

We will cover the secondary education requirements beyond high school currently listing (16) Sixteen training subjects in the 2014 edition.

- Demonstrate a proper use of the systematic approach, and the application of the scientific method.
