SEOC RETURNS TO STEADY STATE

CONCORD, N.H. – The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) will return to steady state status at 0500. Steady state status means the SEOC returns to normal operations and there is no active or ongoing event/incident.

Significant rain fell in a short period of time last night and early this morning. Such significant rain caused damage in parts of southern Grafton County. NH Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) staff will be reaching out to local authorities in the morning to discuss assessing damages.

The National Weather Service Flash Flood Warning for southern Grafton County remains in effect until 0530.
