
What's New at LCHIP This Quarter?

- Natural and Historic Resource summer employees visited, monitored and taught monitoring at 66 sites.




LCHIP Summary

- Matching grants program created by legislature in 2000
- Legislated Purpose: To conserve and preserve the state's most important natural, cultural and historical resources through matching grants and publicprivate partnerships
- Uses no general funds
- Grant funding comes from \$25 surcharge on recording four types of documents (mortgages, mortgage discharges, plans and deeds) at county registry of deeds offices
- Surcharge generates \$3,500,000/year, included in Treasury Department budget
- Receives up to \$200,000 per year from the Conservation and Heritage License Plate Program (Moose Plate) for administrative costs
